





Women contribute significantly in agriculture...



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... and coffee farming...




... but are held back by constraints

- Gender productivity gap (lower yield, income)
- Less access to resources and services
 - Land, labour
 - Education & training
 - Markets for inputs & outputs
 - Financial services
 - Agency

Benefits of closing the gender gap

- Women empowerment and gender equality as goal in itself (SDG 5)
- Positive impact on farm productivity
 - Higher yields and better quality
 - Higher household income

Unlocking productivity reserves to meet rising demand for coffee



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Benefits of closing the gender gap

- Women empowerment and gender equality as goal in itself
- Positive impact on farm productivity
 - Higher yields and better quality
 - Higher household income
- Spill-overs (nutritional status and education level of children)

Addressing the gender gap

- Public policies & services
 - Land certification & property rights
 - Extension services
 - Financial literacy
- Supply-chain policies
 - Certification schemes with gender components

- Track progress towards SDG 5 (Delta Project)
- Ensure ICO facilitated projects are gender sensitive
- Investigate gender gap in coffee consumption
