HOSTING THE 123RD SESSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL COFFEE ORGANIZATION COUNCIL IN NAIROBI FROM 25TH – 29TH MARCH, 2019 IN NAIROBI, KENYA

Further to the verbal offer to host the 123rd Session of the International Coffee Council (ICC), made by the Kenyan delegation earlier this year, I would like to formally invite all Members of the International Coffee Organization to join us in Nairobi for this important Session.
