The aim of this year's International Coffee Day campaign is to show consumers the reality of coffee. With thanks to the support of the All Japan Coffee Association, the Ernesto Illy Foundation and the Delegation of the European Union to Rwanda, the new-look International Coffee Day website features 'An Anthem for International Coffee Day' video shot in the setting of beautiful Kibuye, Rwanda, showing what it takes to create the beans that go into every cup of coffee we drink each day. In addition to calling on all those involved with coffee, either as consumers or as a source of income or employment, to sign the #coffeepledge to call attention to the plight of coffee farmers all over the world, coffee lovers are also invited to take the coffee challenge to enter a global prize draw, in addition to holding an event in celebration of this special day.

Sette continues: "The ICO is committed to supporting our Members and all coffee stakeholders to achieve inclusive and sustainable development and to meet the Sustainable Development Goals. The global coffee community is coming together to address the

challenges impacting on the future of coffee, but we also need your help. Join us in celebrating this special day, and help us to effect change by signing the #coffeepledge, in support of a living income for coffee farmers"

This year International Coffee Day is also special as it marks the publication of the first issue of the ICO new flagship report: the Coffee Development Report 2019: *Growing for Prosperity: Economic viability as the catalyst for a sustainable coffee sector.* With this comprehensive and far-reaching publication the ICO provides hard data and detailed analyses on the root causes and impact of the current coffee price crisis. It also contains an independent assessment of possible actions to address the economic challenge and foster long-term sustainability of the coffee sector in line with the United Nations 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda.
