#### OPPORTUNITY FOR SIGNATURE AND DEPOSIT OF INSTRUMENTS 1 – 4 MARCH 2010

The Executive Director of the International Coffee Organization (ICO), as the chief administrative officer of the Depositary for the International Coffee Agreement (ICA) 2007, communicates the following:

The deadlines for signature of the 2007 Agreement and deposit of instruments of ratification, acceptance or approval are 25 September 2010.

There will be an opportunity for signature of the ICA 2007 and deposit of instruments of ratification, acceptance or approval, or notifications of provisional application, during the 104th Session of the International Coffee Council which will take place in Guatemala City during the week of 1 to 4 March 2010. It should be noted that an exception has been made for signatures of the ICA 2007 to take place outside the ICO headquarters in accordance with paragraph 119 of the Summary of Practice of the Secretary-General as Depositary of Multilateral Treaties:

During the period when, under the provisions of a treaty, its signature is open at Headquarters, the original is not to be removed therefrom. An exception has been made to that principle under very special circumstances, and for a very few days, in order to facilitate the signature of a treaty, when it was anticipated that signatures would be affixed during the convening of a conference on matters related to the treaty, which was held away from Headquarters.

In the case of signature, copies of Full Powers signed by the Head of State, Head of Government or Minister for Foreign Affairs duly authorizing representatives to sign the Agreement should be sent in advance to the ICO for verification. An appointment made for signature during the week of 1 to 4 March should also be made in advance with the ICO Depositary Office (Tel: +44 (0) 20 7612 0600, email: depositary@ico.org).



Document ED-2033/08 Rev. 3, which includes a model of full powers and model instruments of ratification, acceptance or approval, is attached for information. The Annex shows the status of membership of the ICO under the ICA 2007 and the percentage of votes necessary for the entry into force of the ICA 2007. Procedures for membership of the **International Coffee Agreement 2007** 

- 1. The Executive Director presents his compliments and wishes to inform Members and observer Governments about procedures for membership of the International Coffee Agreement (ICA) 2007.
- At its 103<sup>rd</sup> Session from 23 to 25 September 2009 the International Coffee Council approved Resolutions 441 and 442 which respectively provide for Governments to sign the Agreement at the ICO headquarters in London and deposit instruments of ratification, acceptance or approval until 25 September 2010. The 2001 Agreement has been extended by Resolution 443 until 30 September 2010 to enable Governments to complete membership formalities for the ICA 2007.
- 3. ICO Members and observer Governments are invited to contact the Treaty Sections or Legal Offices of their Ministries of Foreign Affairs and request them to undertake the necessary formalities for membership, which include the following:
- (a) signature no later than 25 September 2010, followed by ratification, acceptance or approval by 25 September 2010:
- signature no later than 25 September 2010 and notification of provisional application (b) (this may be the fastest procedure for new Members), followed by ratification, acceptance or approval; and
- accession (this option is only available after the deadline for signature has passed and (c) once the Council has established conditions for accession).

#### **Signature**

4. Signature indicates the intention of a Government to apply the Agreement. Under the provisions of Resolution 441, the Agreement will be open for signature at the Depositary Headquarters until **25 September 2010**. It should be noted that a Government only becomes a Contracting Party to the ICA 2007 after ratifying, accepting or approving it.

#### Steps for signature of the ICA 2007 are summarized as follows:

- (a) prepare an instrument of Full Powers for the proposed signatory in accordance with the section on Full Powers below and Annex III;
- (b) deliver instrument of Full Powers by hand, mail, fax or scanned copy by email to the ICO headquarters in London for <u>advance review</u> (at least three days in advance is suggested);
- (c) make an appointment with the Depositary Office of the ICO to sign the Agreement (during the period that the Agreement is open for signature);
- (d) attend the appointment and present the original instrument of Full Powers (if sent by fax or scanned copy by email previously);
- (e) signature ceremony for the ICA 2007; and
- (f) the ICO, in its capacity as Depositary, will notify Members and non-member Governments about this action.

#### **Full Powers**

- 5. In international law, a Head of State, Head of Government or Minister for Foreign Affairs may sign a treaty in his or her own right. Anyone else needs to produce 'Full Powers' signed by one of those three representatives. Full Powers can take time to produce so they should be prepared <u>well in advance</u> of the proposed date of signature of the Agreement (at least three days in advance is suggested). The UN Treaty Section advises that Full Powers must include the following (see model in Annex III):
- It must be signed by either the Head of State, Head of Government, or Minister for Foreign Affairs
- The signature must be legible
- It should indicate the title of the treaty
- Full Powers must state the full name and title of the representative authorized to sign
- Date and place of signature must be indicated
- Official seal (optional, but cannot replace the signature of one of the three authorized authorities).

#### Ratification, acceptance or approval

- 6. The ICA 2007 requires ratification, acceptance or approval by Governments which have signed it and intend to apply it. Under the provisions of Resolution 442, Members should deposit their instruments of ratification, acceptance or approval with the Depositary by **25 September 2010**. Instruments of ratification, acceptance or approval must be signed by the Head of State, Head of Government, or by the Minister for Foreign Affairs, and deposited with the Depositary. A model instrument, which may be adapted as appropriate, is attached as Annex IV. The UN Treaty Section notes that instruments must include:
- Title, date and place of conclusion of treaty
- The type of action should be clearly identified, e.g. ratification, acceptance or approval
- Full name and title of the person signing the instrument (i.e. the Head of State, Head of Government or Minister for Foreign Affairs)
- An unambiguous expression of the intent of the Government to consider itself bound by the treaty and to undertake faithfully to observe and implement its provisions
- Date and place where the instrument was issued
- Signature of the Head of State, Head of Government or Minister for Foreign Affairs (the official seal is not sufficient).

#### Steps for ratification, acceptance or approval to the Agreement are as follows:

- (a) following signature of the ICA 2007, prepare instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval (as applicable) in accordance with model in Annex IV;
- (b) instrument is signed by Head of State, Head of Government, or Minister for Foreign Affairs;
- (c) deliver the instrument by hand, mail, fax or scanned copy by email to the ICO;
- (d) if the instrument is faxed or sent as a scanned copy to the ICO, deliver the original instrument to the Organization as soon as possible thereafter;
- (e) the ICO will examine the instrument to ensure it is in due and proper form. The date of deposit will be the date on which the instrument is received at the ICO headquarters; and
- (f) the ICO will notify Members and non-member Governments about this action.

#### Notification of provisional application

7. Under the provisions of Article 41 (Provisional application), a signatory Government which intends to ratify, accept or approve the 2007 Agreement may, at any time, notify the Depositary that it will apply the Agreement provisionally in accordance with its legal procedures. Similar wording to that of the model instrument in Annex IV, adapted as appropriate, may be used for notifications of provisional application.

#### Accession

8. Accession is generally used by States wishing to express their consent to be bound by a treaty where the deadline for signature has passed. The Council will review the situation of membership in 2009/10, and may decide at a future session to establish procedures for accession, in accordance with Article 43.
