World Coffee Conference 2010 Guatemala City, Guatemala (26 – 28 February 2010)

On behalf of the Chairman of the World Coffee Conference 2010, President Álvaro Colom of Guatemala, the Executive Director of the International Coffee Organization (ICO), Néstor Osorio, is pleased to announce that the World Coffee Conference 2010 will take place at the Westin Camino Real Hotel in Guatemala City, Guatemala, from 26 to 28 February 2010. The Conference is being hosted by the Guatemalan National Coffee Association (Anacafé).

Coffee is of exceptional importance to the livelihoods of millions of people, particularly in developing countries, and the objective of the 2010 Conference is to bring together high-level stakeholders to analyse and discuss ways of ensuring a sustainable future for the world coffee economy. The theme of the Conference is: 'Coffee for the future: Towards a sustainable coffee sector', with four main Sessions:

Session 1: Economic sustainability: the economics of production Session 2: Economic sustainability: the economics of demand

Session 3: Environmental sustainability

Session 4: Social sustainability

Sub-sessions will deal with topics such as changes and trends in world production and world consumption, production costs and constraints, development of markets for differentiated coffee, outlook for supply and demand, women and coffee and the Millennium Development Goals and support for producers.

There will be an opening ceremony on the afternoon of Friday 26 February, with the President of Guatemala, H.E. Mr Álvaro Colom, Heads of State and Ministers from ICO Member countries and high-level representatives of multilateral donor organizations including Supachai Panitchpakdi, Secretary-General of UNCTAD; H.E. Mr Ali Mchumo, Managing Director of the Common Fund for Commodities; Christian Rasch, Chairman of the 2010 World Coffee Conference Organizing Committee; Ricardo Villanueva, Chairman of the Board of the Guatemalan National Coffee Association; and Néstor Osorio, Executive Director of the ICO.
